***S3M-3622# Bill Butler: Drumchapel is Top of the Table**—That the Parliament congratulates Drumchapel Table Tennis Club on its 20th anniversary; notes that it is the most successful table tennis club in Britain, with over 400 members, and caters for all levels of ability; further notes that several of its players will be representing Scotland at the 2009 Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships to be held in Glasgow in May; acknowledges the valuable role the club plays, with support from Drumchapel LIFE, Skyform, Culture and Sport Glasgow and Strathclyde Police, in promoting healthy lifestyles, tackling antisocial behaviour and developing young people's potential through its imaginative after-school programme; pays tribute to the hard work and dedication of its head coach and driving force Terry McLernon; recognises the positive impact sports clubs make in communities across Scotland, and agrees with Drumchapel Table Tennis club that sport must be properly supported at grassroots level and looks to the Scottish Government and local authorities to facilitate such an approach.

S3M-3563# John Wilson: Strathclyde Police Prolific Offender Programme—That the Parliament congratulates Strathclyde Police on the success of the Prolific Offender Programme, aimed specifically at drug and alcohol offenders, which has resulted in a 30% reduction in offending rates, particularly regarding shop lifting, housebreaking and prostitution; welcomes the inclusion of counselling, education and housing opportunities as part of the rehabilitation process under this pioneering initiative aimed at improving community safety, and notes that since 2007 over 194 people have been involved in the initiative while 95 people remain engaged in the programme.

S3M-3559# Kenneth Gibson: The Future of the Sunday Mail and Daily Record—That the Parliament notes with deep concern the decision of Trinity Mirror to merge the editorial content of the *Daily Record* and *Sunday Mail* with the loss of up to 30% of journalistic staff, based primarily in Glasgow and the West of Scotland; recognises that both newspapers are an integral part of Scottish culture and that to diminish their individual identities would be a serious blow to the diversity, vibrancy and quality of the Scottish media; believes that the loss

of their separate identities would undoubtedly lead to the erosion of circulation at both titles, leading inevitably to further job losses; considers that Trinity Mirror is highly profitable and that there is no need to undertake such drastic restructuring, and therefore very much hopes that good sense may prevail over the future of two of Scotland's leading titles.

S3M-3540# Ted Brocklebank: The Future of Scottish Newspapers—That the Parliament notes with concern the recent announcement by Trinity Mirror that a quarter of journalists at the *Daily Record* and the *Sunday Mail* will lose their jobs due to the newspapers merging; further notes that this follows on from proposed cutbacks in editorial staff at the Herald and Times Group and concerns about the future of other Scottish daily and weekly newspapers including Johnston Press, which owns the Fife Free Press Group; recognises that, while the crisis in the Scottish print media mirrors the situation worldwide with the economic downturn dramatically affecting circulation and advertising, the Scottish press faces particular difficulties including the loss of government advertising to the internet, and believes that the democratic process requires a vibrant Scottish newspaper sector with all sides working to minimise job losses and find long-term solutions.

S3M-3443# Cathy Peattie: Advanced Driving—That the Parliament notes that most road accidents are caused by driver error and therefore are potentially avoidable; further notes that significant improvements in driver safety can be achieved through advanced driving courses, especially in respect of observation and hazard awareness skills; recognises that a better driving technique can reduce fuel consumption and vehicle maintenance and insurance costs, benefiting both the driver and the environment; commends the work of the Institute of Advanced Motorists and in particular the Forth Valley (Stirling) Group that, with sponsorship from Ineos, are offering an advanced driving course targeted at young drivers, which is more comprehensive and considerably cheaper than the Pass Plus course, and believes that there is enormous potential in advanced driving courses with benefits that far outweigh the costs, that the extension and wider availability of such schemes should be supported and that young and inexperienced drivers should be encouraged to participate.

S3M-3441# Nanette Milne: Childhood Cancer - More Than My Illness—That the Parliament highlights a survey by children's cancer charity CLIC Sargent that found that 97% of children and young people with cancer say that it is important for them to be able to return home during their treatment but that many parents in Scotland say that they do not get the support that they need when their child is at home; notes that children and young people say that living with cancer is about more than their illness; expresses concern at findings that about half of parents who want support with the education of their child with cancer, such as access to home tutoring, are not getting it or are finding that it is insufficient; recognises the need to help children and young people and their families in rural and urban areas across Scotland to keep up with their ordinary lives; welcomes CLIC Sargent's report, *More Than My Illness*, published on 13 February 2009, proposing innovative ways of reaching families of sick children across Scotland; notes the success of the Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital and the CLIC Sargent nurse in helping to coordinate and plan aspects of care and support for children in Aberdeenshire; further welcomes the commitment to both specialist and local support made by the *National Delivery Plan for Children and Young People's Specialist Services in Scotland*, and highlights the need for key workers to better coordinate and plan all aspects of care and support for every child and young person with cancer.

S3M-3411# Jamie McGrigor: Songbird Survival—That the Parliament is aware of the concerns of many bird lovers throughout the United Kingdom about the decline of the songbird population; notes research that suggests that over the last 40 years many species of songbird have seen a reduction in numbers of 50% or more with some species declining by over 90%; recognises that a number of factors have led to these declines and that these should be considered by policymakers, and commends individual birdwatchers and bird groups in the Highlands and Islands and elsewhere in Scotland for their role in recording species' numbers and the work of organisations such as Songbird Survival that campaign to raise awareness of the threat to our songbird species and ensure the creation of a balanced biodiversity.

S3M-3399# John Wilson: Pressurised Area Status in North Lanarkshire—That the Parliament welcomes the decision by the Scottish Government to grant pressurised area status to the North Lanarkshire Council areas of Cumbernauld and Moodiesburn, which enables the council to suspend the right to buy to tenants who started their tenancies after 30 September 2002, and considers that the action by the government and council could stop the decline of housing stock lost through right to buy and ensure that the council can maintain control over existing housing stock.

S3M-3357# Sarah Boyack: Support for Unpaid Carers—That the Parliament recognises the vital role played by unpaid carers across Scotland in providing essential care and support to people whose lives are seriously affected by illness or disability and the work done to support carers by the Voice of Carers Across Lothian (VOCAL) in Edinburgh and the Coalition of Carers in Scotland; notes that the estimated replacement cost for unpaid carers in Edinburgh has increased by £98.3 million to £554.5 million; is concerned that one in five carers has given up work to provide care, the same proportion suffer poor health, only 40% have had a break from their responsibilities of more than two days and 73% live in fuel poverty, and therefore considers that the contribution made by unpaid carers to the Scottish economy should be recognised by improving the sharing of best practice in the provision of support with other European countries and local authorities across the United Kingdom and by improving the quality of support available for respite care, training, support services and young carers in Scotland.

S3M-3352# Bob Doris: Good Morning Glasgow Doing a Great Job for Glaswegians—That the Parliament acknowledges the tremendous contribution that the Good Morning Project, also known as Good Morning Glasgow and based in Possilpark in the north of Glasgow, has made to the lives of many vulnerable Glaswegians; congratulates it on its award-winning telephone-based befriending service whereby trained staff call clients at a pre-arranged time each morning and often in the afternoon and evening; believes that the service contributes to better mental health, reduces isolation, promotes social inclusion and potentially enables elderly and vulnerable people to stay in their own homes for longer; notes

that formal evaluations show that 100% of clients reported reduced feelings of isolation and exclusion along with improved feelings of safety; further acknowledges that the lowest rating was 97% of clients who believed that the service gave peace of mind to family and friends; believes that this demonstrates the invaluable contribution Good Morning Glasgow makes to individuals and the community as a whole, and considers that similar services could benefit people throughout Scotland.

S3M-3205# Rob Gibson: Supporting Conventional Plant Breeding—That the Parliament welcomes a growing body of evidence that Scottish farmers, crofters and growers can benefit from the results of successful experiments to produce home-grown food for both animals and humans that does not rely on transgenic modification of plant material; also welcomes the recent work of the Scottish Crop Research Institute in producing highly nutritious purple-pigmented potatoes; applauds the Sárvári Research Trust based at Bangor University that confirms that blight-resistant Sárpo potatoes, which were successfully trialed in the Black Isle, are suitable for Scottish conditions; recalls that the Scottish Agricultural College has backed an international research collaboration on the Green Pig project, which plans to use home-grown legume varieties to reduce reliance on imported and expensive soya bean meal and so reduce costs for Scottish livestock producers; notes the scientific analysis of Dr John Fagan of Global ID Group, which shows that although non-GM pig feed costs a bit more than GM feed because of feed-to-meat conversion efficiency when using non-GM feed the actual cost per animal is lower, and therefore believes that a conventional plant breeding policy is an essential basis for the Scottish national food and drink policy, which itself dovetails with the conclusions of the International Assessment of Agricultural Science and Technology for Development that small-scale farming and ecological methods provide the way forward to avert the current world food crisis.

S3M-3132# Sandra White: Opposition to Parkhead Fire Station Closure—That the Parliament expresses concern over the proposals of Strathclyde Fire and Rescue Service management to close Parkhead fire station; believes that the communities of Shettleston, Tollcross, Haghill, Dalmarnock, Riddrie, Carntyne and Mount Vernon, which will now be served by a new station in Cambuslang, will see response times to incidents increasing, which in turn will lead to an increase in the number of fire deaths and injuries; notes that Parkhead fire station covers some of the poorest communities in the United Kingdom and that it has been identified that the main causes of fires are related to social and economic problems, drug and alcohol abuse and areas of poverty and high unemployment, and believes that Strathclyde Fire and Rescue Service management's proposals will be detrimental to those communities affected.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND LICENSING (SCOTLAND) BILL: REFERRAL AT STAGE 1

1. The Criminal Justice and Licensing (Scotland) Bill was introduced on 5 March. The Bill falls within the remit of the following committees for the following reasons:

Justice	Parts 1 to 7 of the Bill make provision for a wide range of criminal justice matters. In addition, Part 9 of the Bill concerns alcohol licensing, which falls within the remit of the Justice Committee by virtue of being a matter for which the Cabinet Secretary for Justice has responsibility.
Local Government and Communities	Part 8 of the Bill covers licensing of activities by local authorities under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
Economy, Energy and Tourism	The licensing provisions in the Bill will affect the retail sector.
Health and Sport	Public health is one of the objectives underpinning the licensing provisions in the Bill.

2. The Justice Committee has the main interest in the Bill and it should therefore be designated as the lead committee under Rule 9.6.1.
3. While it would be possible for Part 8 of the Bill to be considered separately by the Local Government and Communities Committee, there are also sufficient links between Part 8 and the other matters covered by the Bill to justify the Justice Committee taking the lead on all parts of the Bill (for example, section 121 brings powers in relation to licensing conditions for activities covered by the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 more into line with the equivalent powers in relation to alcohol licensing, while section 122 gives equivalent powers to civilian employees of the police as are available to police officers in connection with the enforcement of these types of licences). The interests of the Economy, Energy and Tourism Committee and the Health and Sport Committee can be covered by the Justice Committee's consideration of the Bill, given that these aspects are integral to licensing policy.
4. On this basis, there is no need to designate any of the other committees mentioned above as secondary committees. Lack of formal designation does not, of course, prevent those committees from considering the Bill if they wished to do so.

If these deadlines applied to General and Themed Question Times on 23 April 2009, the deadline for members to submit their names would be 8 April 2009, the first Wednesday of the Easter recess, and to lodge questions on 15 April 2009, the second Wednesday of the recess. Members whose names were selected would have to be contacted in sufficient time to enable them to lodge questions at a time when several are likely to be on holiday.
3. Rule 13.6.A.4 of Standing Orders enables the period during which members may submit their names for selection also to end on “such time or day as may, exceptionally, be specified by the Parliament on a motion of the Parliamentary Bureau”. It is considered that the logistical difficulties presented by both deadlines falling during the recess are such that it would be justified on this occasion to set a different deadline for submitting names. This has been agreed in relation to previous recesses. It is not considered necessary to alter the deadline for members lodging questions as this deadline has frequently fallen in the last week of a recess.
4. It is suggested that the Bureau should recommend that the period for members to submit their names for selection for Question Times on 23 April 2009 should end at 12 noon on Wednesday 1 April, the last Wednesday before the Easter recess. This deadline would enable the members who are randomly selected to be notified when the Parliament is still meeting. If this recommendation is agreed it will be incorporated in an announcement in the Business Bulletin on Thursday 26 March 2009. The themes for Question Times on 23 April are Education and Lifelong Learning and Europe, External Affairs and Culture.

Recommendation

5. That the Bureau agrees that the period for members to submit their names for selection for Question Times on 23 April 2009 should end at 12 noon on Wednesday 1 April 2009.
6. The necessary draft Bureau motion is attached in the annex.

FIRST MINISTER'S QUESTION TIME ON 7 AND 28 MAY 2009 – DEADLINE FOR LODGING QUESTIONS

1. This paper considers arrangements for First Minister's Question Time on 7 and 28 May 2009, on which the preceding Mondays (when questions must be lodged) are holidays and the office of the clerk is closed.
2. Under Rule 13.6.1, First Minister's Questions should be lodged by 2.00 pm on the Monday before the First Minister's Question Time at which the question would be answered, or at "such time or day as may exceptionally be specified by the Parliament on a motion of the Parliamentary Bureau". It is suggested that the Bureau recommends that the deadline for lodging First Minister's Questions is set at 4.00 pm on the preceding Thursdays: 30 April and 21 May. This is considered to allow members sufficient opportunity to lodge questions, although unavoidably there will be some loss of topicality.
3. This arrangement would enable the Presiding Officer to select questions the same day and the selected questions to be included in the Business Bulletin compiled that evening. A similar arrangement has been agreed for previous First Minister Questions affected by holiday Mondays.

Recommendations

4. It is therefore recommended that:
 - The period for lodging First Minister's Questions for First Minister's Question Time on 7 May 2009 ends at 4.00 pm on Thursday 30 April.
 - The period of lodging First Minister's Questions for First Minister's Question Time on 28 May 2009 ends at 4.00 pm on Thursday 21 May.
