Proposed shared space scheme Kirkintilloch

Regarding the above proposal, my husband and I wish to register our utter dismay that our Council seems to be determined to introduce this change to our town centre regardless of road safety or public outrage.

I have signed petitions, joined protest demonstrations and also attended information forums...yet despite continually registering disapproval, I keep being told that it is going ahead and that it will improve our town!!!
