Consideration of Responses to PE1535

I thank all the organisations asked to consider my petition by the committee for their detailed responses to my proposals. On the issue of plastic bags I understand the position that the Scottish Government have taken considering that they have only just introduced a fee for plastic bags. I understand that they would like to see the impact of the charge before going for the next steps. However I still hold the belief that eventually we should look at a complete ban as many other countries have. As well as this I would add that if we are already looking at a 90% reduction in usage, why shouldn't we push for 100%?
